Salvation is through faith and works.

James 2:24: "Ye see then how that by works a man is justified, and not by faith only."

Salvation is through faith and baptism.

Mark 16:16: "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned."

Salvation is through faith and confession.

Romans 10:9: "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved."

Salvation is through predestination.

Eph. 1:11: "In whom also we have obtained an inheritance, being predestinated according to the purpose of him who worketh all things after the counsel of his own will."
